

I am sending my April email early because in times like these, we just need to communicate when we need to communicate. And communicating with you right now feels appropriate.

I have heard from so many of you asking if we will mobilize our chapter to help with the COVID-19 mask shortage. I want to assure you that we are busily trying to do just that.

I am in daily communication with the Baylor Hospital Administration and we hope to finalize the specifics of their request in the next few days.

Here is a run down of what we have done:

• We have designed a process for you to sign up to make masks that includes:

- We will distribute an email with the Baylor approved pattern and fabric requirements as well as post it on our blog.
- You will be able to select either porch pick up or porch drop off as the way you return your masks. Our target for mask completion is March 31.
- We will deliver the masks to Baylor for distribution within their network
- Our original plan was to use the widely circulated Deaconess Hospital
 mask pattern and instructions. Fortunately, before we sent that out to
 you we learned it would not be accepted by the hospital. The last thing
 we want to do to you is waste your time and materials on something that
 the hospital can not use. And the last thing we want for the hospitals is
 to burden them with an unusable donation they ultimately have to figure
 out how to dispose.
- We now have an approved pattern from Baylor Hospital. I have made a prototype for them. As recent as this morning I spoke to the administration and clarified the available fabric, 100% quilting cotton, explaining it is breathable and tightly woven but not water repellent. My contact was taking this information into their meeting but said this is likely to be a problem. They may prefer to provide us with the fabric or in the face of the current crisis, may determine which standards they feel comfortable relaxing.
- I know there is an elastic shortage, which we will only further contribute
 to if we make unusable masks. However, we also know that fabric ties
 are accepted so even if there is no more elastic to be had, we will be
 able to mobilize once we have final details from Baylor.
- Finally, I want to assure that our caution is appreciated by Baylor. Because of our diligence in working with them on mask specifications, they have asked if we could help coordinate this effort statewide once the details are finalized. I have assured them that I can reach out to other Texas ASG presidents to invite them into their own local effort.

I hope by sharing the details of what is happening behind the scenes, any concerns you may be feeling that we are not stepping into this crisis the way we should will be eased. Our approach is a slower one, but I believe it is one that will help us be effective in our efforts.

My deep desire for each one of you is that you remain safe and healthy during this time. Take moments throughout the day to take care of your mind and body in the ways that are most life-giving to you. We will get through this and we will eventually look back on it as a memory.
