If you still haven't cleaned out your stash and have fabric to donate, let us know. We're planning our next one in October if we have enough to sell.








And what's **Beader's Workshop** up to these days? Take a look at Catherine Seles, Annette Berlyn and Diane Montgomery all working hard on their current projects.




And here's what Catherine designed that I'm hoping to copy. It's so delicate and pretty.







